

Relationship Between Family Health, Personality Trait and Problem Solving Styles with Delinquent Behavior of Adolescents

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In order to investigate the relationship between family health, personality traits and problem-solving styles with delinquent behaviors in adolescents, randomly clustered male students of three maladaptive classes were ed at the bases of the tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grade secondary schools (N = 150) a district education unit. The required information was collected based on 4 types of questionnaires, problem solving style, Neo-questionnaire of personality questionnaire, Factors Affecting Juvenile Delinquency and Family Health Questionnaire (Fos). For statistical analysis, multivariate regression analysis was used. The relationship between family health and delinquent behavior of adolescents is inversely proportional There and at the level of 1% significance level of less than 1% error intensity of this relationship is equal to -0. 346. Another result is that there is a meaningful relationship between personality traits and juvenile delinquency behaviors and the severity of this relationship is -0. 274, which indicates the inverse relationship between this two-variable. Also, at the level of error 1% and the significance level is less than 1% Be Another finding of this study shows that there is a significant relationship between solving problem solving styles and juvenile delinquency behaviors and the severity of this relationship is -0. 115, which indicates an inverse relation. The error rate is 1% and the significance level is less than 1%.
