
A study of effects of mechanisms of the international common law on the double citizenship

Abstract Globalization (Becoming globalized) as a change - maker macro process has influenced on the various dimensions of social life in human societies. By expansion of connections' revolution and increase of transactions and social contacts among societies in the political-national limits, one of the domains which have been affected and confronted the governments in the national systems with legal challenges is domain of a subject known as nationality or citizenship so that national sovereignties in the territorial limits have been faced with developing process of double citizenship of real and legal persons. Growth of phenomenon of double citizen ship/ nationality , on one hand, and intensive tendency of governments towards implementation of sovereignty, on the other hand, has caused that real and legal persons in the international arena sustain a lot of damages and losses.
