

Relationship between early maladaptive schemas and self-esteem with adolescent drug use tendency

Abstract The purpose of this study was to investigate the relationship between the early maladaptive schemas and self-esteem with the prevalence of drug use in adolescents. In this study, early maladaptive schemas and self-esteem as predictor variables and drug addiction tendency in adolescents The criterion variable was considered; the statistical population of this study was all high school adolescents in Rasht. Regarding the sample variables, 146 people were ed by cluster sampling. Self-esteem questionnaires, early maladaptive schemas, and Egypt's tendency toward narcotics were used. Pearson correlation and multiple regression were used. Results showed that correlation values between early maladaptive schemas and self-esteem with substance use tendency The drug is statistically significant ($p > 0.05$); there is a negative correlation between self-esteem and drug use tendency ($r = -39 / -0$), which is statistically significant ($0.01 > P$). Therefore, with 99% confidence, it can be concluded that with increasing self-esteem and tendency to drug use decreases. The results of regression show that four variables (self-esteem, cognitive impairment, anxiety, and others) can explain 28 percent of variance of drug use tendency (criterion variable).
