The Relationship of Marital Conflicts and Maternal Burnout with the Amount of Boys' Motivation for the Advancement

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The present study aimed to investigate the relationship between marital conflicts and burnout of mothers with the level of developmental motivation of male children. In order to obtain information, 181 people were distributed randomly among the mothers of cultural schools of public and nursing schools in district 2 of Rasht in the academic year of 97-96. In order to investigate the variables of the research, Barati and Snyani marital conflict questionnaires, Maslach and Jackson burnout questionnaires, McInternational and Sinkleer educational motivation questionnaire were used. To analyze the data, PLS software was used. The results showed that there is a correlation between marital conflicts with the rate of motivation of the children of the mothers of Rasht. On the other hand, these results indicated that there was no correlation between job burnout and the rate of motivation of the children of the mothers of Rasht. Finally, the results showed that each of the variables of marital conflict and burnout can explain the variance of motivation for progress. The results can be used to improve psychological issues related to family relationships, as well as how to manage organizational occupations and how to fit the family's internal conditions.
