Relationship between Marital Satisfaction, Marital adjustment and Social support with Domestic Violence against Wives (Case Study: Women Referring to Consultation Centers in Rasht)

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The main purpose of this study was to investigate the relationship between marital satisfaction, marital adjustment and social support with domestic violence against spouses. The research method was descriptive-correlational. The statistical population of the study consisted of all women referring to counseling centers in Rasht(2017)using available sampling method, A sample of 277 respondents was ed. Research questionnaires include the scale of domestic violence, marital satisfaction, marital adjustment and social support. Multivariate regression test was used to analyze the hypotheses. The results showed a significant correlation between domestic violence against spouse with marital satisfaction (correlation coefficient: -0.447), marital adjustment (correlation coefficient: -0.451) and social support (correlation coefficient: 0.465) . Also, the regression model has been able to predict 33.3% of the variance of domestic violence against the spouse. The beta coefficients reported indicate that the best predictor of domestic violence against the spouse is marital satisfaction (beta coefficient: 0.248), social support (beta coefficient: 0.246), and marital adjustment (beta coefficient: 0.225(

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
