

Comparison of Conflict Resolution Techniques (Argumentation - Verbal Aggression - Violence) and Emotional Intelligence in Adolescent Girls with Addicted Fathers and Normal Girl

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Addiction as a social issue is one of the most important phenomena of human life. If parents are trapped in drugs, their children will also be vulnerable in every respect, and problems such as increased conflict and decreased emotional intelligence will emerge. The purpose of this study was to compare conflict resolution techniques (reasoning - verbal aggression - violence) and emotional intelligence in adolescent girls with addicted fathers and adolescent girls. The present study was based on a causal-comparative study. The statistical population of the study consisted of all girl students with addict father and normal high school girl in Rasht, Iran, in the second semester of the academic year of 1391-97. The sample size was used by sampling method and 120 students (60 students with addicted father and 60 normal students) were ed. This means that all teenage students with addicted fathers complete the questionnaire in terms of age (14-16 years old), academic background, father's presence, normal peers and two groups. The tools used in this study included parent-child conflict solving questionnaires and emotional intelligence intelligence. Data were analyzed using t-test, single variable variance analysis and multivariate analysis using SPSS software. The results showed that there is a difference between the conflict resolution technique and its components in adolescent girls with addict father and normal female adolescents. Also, another finding showed that there was a significant difference between emotional intelligence variable and its components among adolescent girls of two groups. It can be concluded that parents who abuse substance are less able to support the emotional and social support of their child, and the overwhelming problems of behavior and interaction between these children can
